1. Welcome

Miss Whiteley welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Children in Need

Miss Whiteley asked the council for any feedback from their classes and it was established that almost everyone would like school to raise money for Children in Need. Next Miss Whiteley asked if anyone had any fundraising ideas. Both year 6 classes, Year 5 LM and Year 3 ES would like a non-uniform day while Year 5 RA suggested wearing Pyjamas for the day as this they thought would be an easy way to raise lots of money. Both Year 6 classes and Year 3 RK would like to organise a cake sale while Year 6 SK and Year 5 RA thought running a nail polish stall. Other ideas were organising a Pokemon card tournament, Year 3 RK also thought a disco would be a good idea. Year 6 SK and Year 3 RK would like to hold a football match and sell ice-cream.

Action: Miss Whiteley to notify Mrs Stott that school would like to try and raise money for Children in Need and to pass on the fundraising ideas.

3. Playground Markings
