Apologies

1. Welcome

Miss Whiteley welcomed everyone to the meeting

2. Generous June

Miss Whiteley asked for any feedback from classes regarding activities that we could have during Generous June.

The only class to discuss this was Y5LM. Adwaya told the Council that children in his class had suggested having 'secret friends'. Then everyone would perform 'acts of kindness' to their secret friend. The representatives thought that this was a good idea.

The Council were informed by Miss Whiteley that Isla, the Children's Mayor would be visiting school at 12.30pm on 13th June and asked if some of the representatives could swap their lunches to earlier time and make themselves available to meet with Isla.

3. YEP Hospice 40^t Anniversary Fundraiser and Glass Guardians

Skye told the Council that children in Year 5LM would like to hold a bake sale and a penalty shoot-out in order to raise money for the hospices while Davina said that Year 3ES would like to have a nail painting stall as they thought that this would raise lots of money.

Michael Y3RK added that his class would be keen to get involved in the Glass Guardians initiative.

4. Fairtrade Workshops

Miss Whiteley informed the Council members that the re-scheduled Fairtrade Workshops would be taking place on Wednesday 23rd May and that a group of children in Years 1, 2 and 6 would be participating.

Following the workshops, Miss Whiteley asked the class representatives from the year groups involved if they could ask for feedback about the workshops so that if successful then could look at repeating the following year.

Action: Representatives to ask for feedback from peers following workshops.

5. AOB

Adwaya Y5LM talked about the matter of the location of the bike and scooter lockups. This had been raised by several members of his class. The lock ups are currently located in the playground near to the Reception playground/Shelter. The issue raised is that some children had difficulty in retrieving their bikes/scooters following clubs taking place after school as at times there was not an adult available to supervise with the retrieval and then they had to wheel the bike/scooter through school.

The question asked was if it would be possible to have a lock up for bikes and scooters in a different location near the school entrance.

Action: Miss Whiteley to speak with Mrs Stott as to supervision issues.
